



## STUDENT LEADERSHIP

### 1.0 **PURPOSE**

- 1.1 To encourage student leadership and responsibility.
- 1.2 To establish and maintain a positive school climate, students will take positions as Student Representative Councillors, House Captains and Vice Captains, School Captains, classroom leaders and monitors.
- 1.3 Student leaders are expected to embrace school values and model positive behaviours.

### 2.0 **BROAD GUIDELINES**

- 2.1 Student Representative Council will comprise an elected student from every class, supervised by a teacher. A Year 6 CAPTAIN will also be appointed through a selection process with Principal and Year Six teacher.
- 2.2 Student Representative Council should meet a minimum of twice a term.
- 2.3 Student Representative Councillors should be encouraged to discuss any matter related to student wellbeing and engagement in school, student voice and agency, and the condition and facilities of the school.
- 2.4 The Principal will ratify any Student Representative Council decision prior to the implementation of that decision.
- 2.5 Student Representative Council reports are to be made regularly to School Council.
- 2.6 By invitation or by Student Representative Council request, representatives of Student Representative Council may attend School Council meetings.
- 2.7 House Captains and Vice Captains will be elected from the Grades 5 and 6 students.
- 2.8 Grade 6 students may apply for the positions of School Captain. These applicants will be interviewed by the Principal and school teachers. Two students will be selected for the two School Captain positions, regardless of gender.
- 2.9 Monitors will take responsibility for tasks both in the classroom and around the school.
- 2.10 Individual classrooms may operate with class captains. Teacher choice.
